

Stravinsky Survives Tomahawk Attack

Fans of both the Cleveland Indians and Igor Stravinsky's music should be satisfied by arrangements currently being worked out by WJW-TV.

The station ran up against the unfortunate fact that it had an Indians-Washington game scheduled for 8-11 this Thursday night.

That schedule was made up quite a while before CBS released the information that it was going to run "Noah and the Flood," dance-drama by Stravinsky, at 9 the same night.

The musical production is to be the world premiere of the work. It is eagerly awaited by both the professional musical world and less learned music and dance fans.

CHANNEL 8 says it definitely will run the Stravinsky work on videotape. Just when is a little uncertain, but CBS is known to have given permission for the telecast at a time and perhaps date other than that being utilized on the network.

Pre-empting a scheduled ball game is a fairly difficult matter for a local station. It means money, among other things. The station tries to stick to its original schedule. It has firm commitments with

the baseball sponsors. So if you were looking forward to the widely advertised Stravinsky work, do not be disappointed. It will appear, and in prime time, too. It could even be televised to coincide exactly with the composer's 80th birthday, Monday.

Dr. Edward Teller, called "Father of the H Bomb," will be in town to talk about this country's current series of A Bomb tests on "The Mike Douglas Show" Wednesday afternoon on Channel 3.

Mike Wallace, already off the air for Westinghouse (his "PM" is going into repeats, then leaving the air June 22), will take off soon for a round-the-world trip. He'll send back radio features to be used on NBC stations, including KYW here.

Howard K. Smith's current events series on Channel 5 Wednesday nights has been renewed for next season, but it will switch to Sunday nights at 10:30.

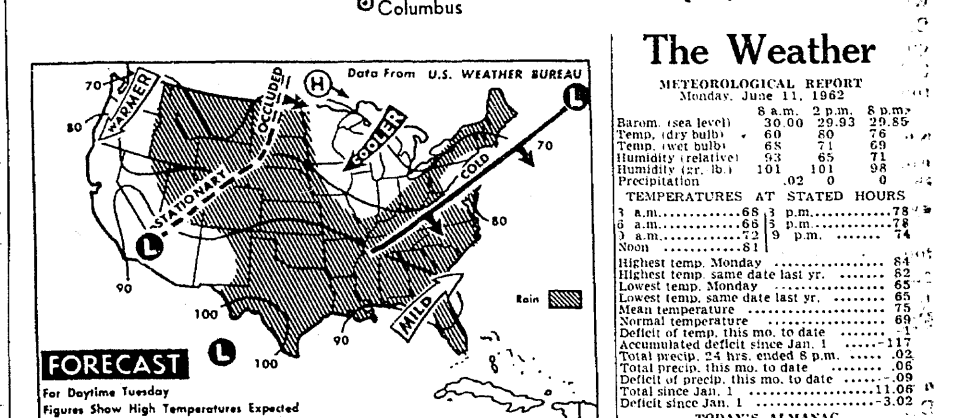
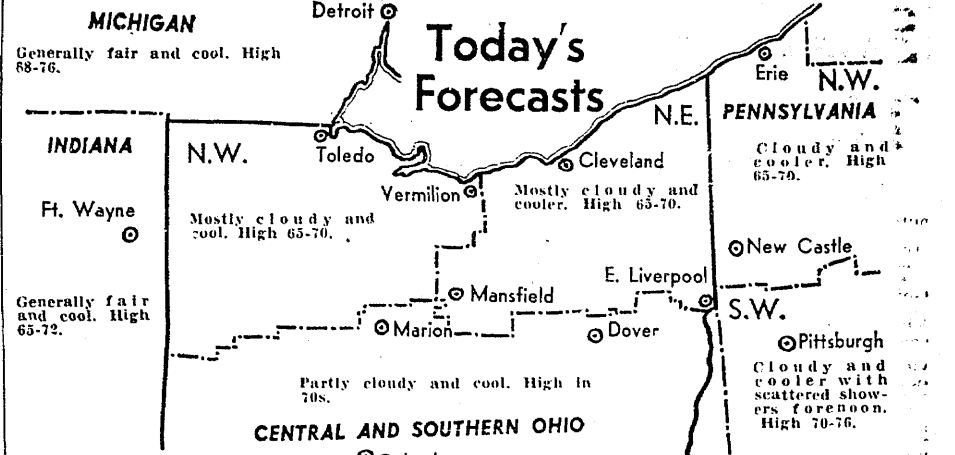
